In each class

Children are able to move freely and explore in a safe, challenging and beautiful space with other children at the same stage of development. The room is filled with handmade toys, different natural materials and objects from nature.

Parents come together in a supportive environment. Relax in a comfortable space.

Ask questions, share concerns and enjoy discussion. Have the opportunity to cultivate the art of observation and discover what it can reveal about your child and yourself.

Classes are organized by stage of development:

- infants from 6 weeks of age
- crawling babies
- young walking babies
- toddlers

Classes meet once a week. Tuition for each 8-week session is \$280. Classes are held at Hari's RIE studio in Santa Monica. Families are invited to join any time space is available.
